Feathered leaf Finials quilt designs – by Anke de Haan



This ruler is part of the Feathered Leaf set. De sizes of the 4 leaves are:

- 2 3/4"
- 2 1/4"
- 1 ¾"
- 1 1/4"

Apart from using this ruler as the finish on the feather pattern you can also use them separately, either in an 8-, 6- or 5- point setting.

This ruler only has a support line in the middle of each leaf, in this pattern, the edge of the ruler has been used as a second support line.

The 9 designs in the quilt have all been made with the 8-point crosshair ruler. The blocks are 6"x6".

The measurements above are measured from the edge of the ruler; if the needle is in the middle of the support line, the bottom edge of the ruler needs to be on that support line.

Some designs start at $\frac{1}{2}$ " or $\frac{1}{2}$ " from the center, check the exact measurement of the starting point with the support line with your spacing gauge (see attached drawings), and position the ruler there. Travel from the center to the starting point.

The designs have all been drawn in real size, check with your finials ruler which size has been used. Keep in mind that the needle is ¼" from the edge of the ruler foot.

All designs start from the center.

In block 4 the vertical and horizontal arcs have been made with the 6" arc or the 6" spiral from the sampler set.

In block 9 the square around the center design is made with a straight ruler, for example the straight side of your 12" arc ruler. Position the ruler right on the top of the leaves to ensure the $\frac{1}{2}$ " distance from the top of the leaves. In the center of the straight line, you create three leaves.

For the echo in block 5 and 6 a bigger size leaf is used, use your spacing gauge at $\frac{1}{2}$ " to create an echo of $\frac{1}{4}$ ".

For the designs in block 7 and 8, you first create half a leaf on the diagonal lines, at the top of the half leaf, you create 3 leaves. Then you finish the second half of your first leaf to return to the center of the design.
